Coffee Morning | Positive Discipline Part 2: Monday, 20 October

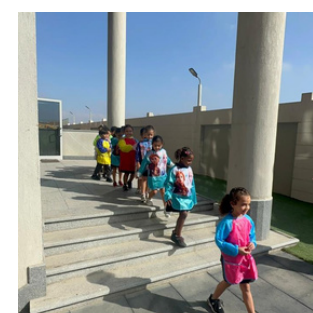

It was heartwarming to see students dressed in pink to show their support and raise awareness for this important cause.

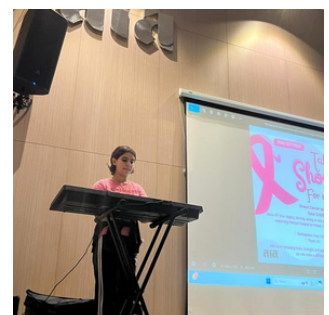


MY TALENT SHOW

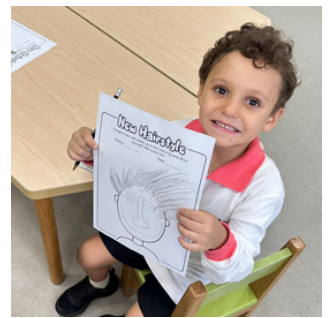


K1

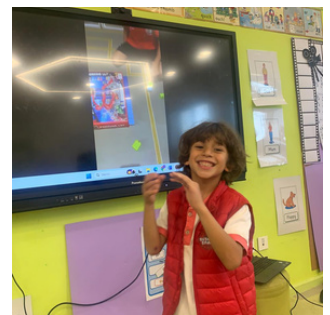
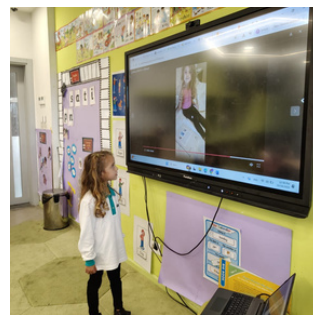
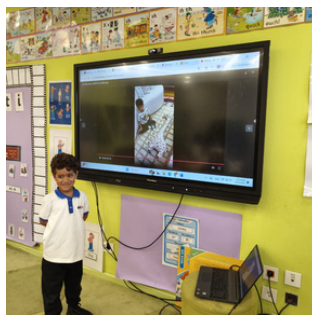
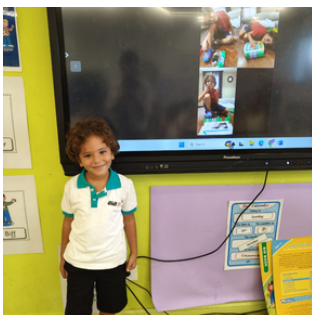


K2

Roll it, press it, say it! K2 A makes sounds come alive!

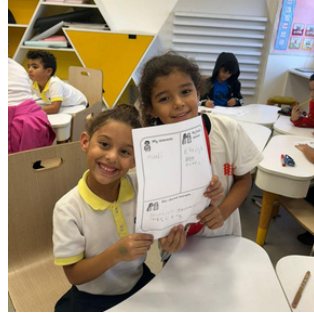


K2 B inquirers shared their amazing at-home measuring activities using non-standard units! They proudly showed their videos and talked about their learning in class.

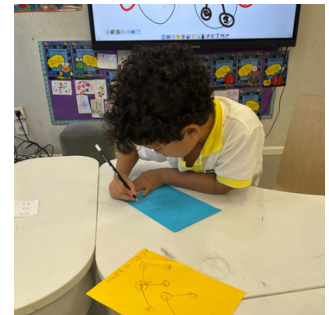


Grade 1

Grade 1 B students shared their interests and talents with their friends, discovering what they have in common while being communicators who express themselves confidently and listen to others with respect.

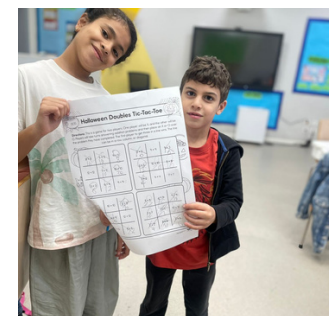


Grade 1 A students worked in groups — expanding numbers into tens and ones.



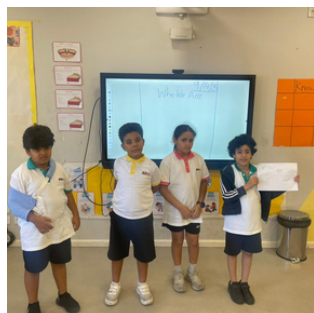
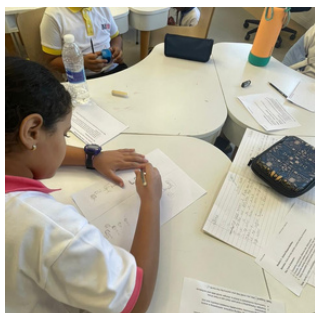
Grade 2

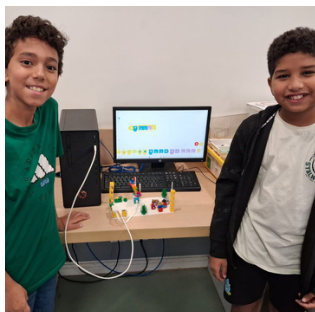


Grade 5

Grade 7

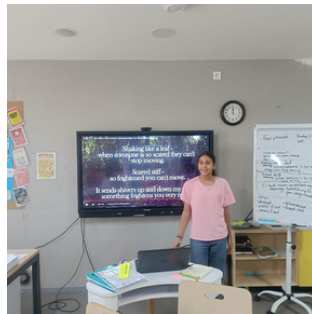
Grade 7 STEM Highlights

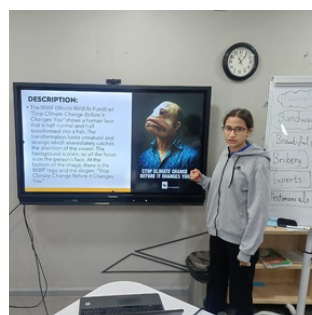
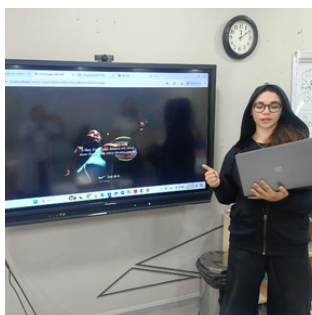

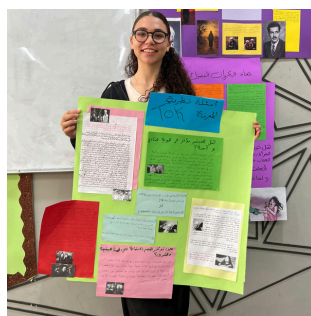


Grade 12

Music

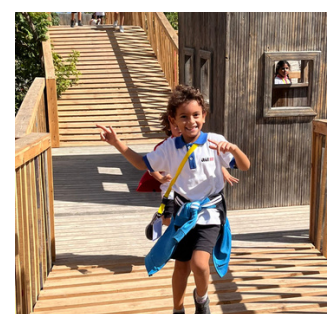
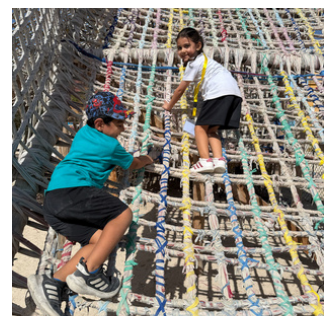
